John Ward Creek Crossing Closed to Horseback Riders


Kennesaw, GA – Effective immediately, the John Ward Creek crossing just south of the Illinois Monument is closed to horseback riders until further notice. This closure stems from a safety concern due to hazardous conditions relating to an unstable streambed. The closure affects the creek crossing between Milepost 3.5 and Milepost 4 of the Kolb's Farm East Trail.

Superintendent Patrick Gamman states, "We are concerned for the safety of all park users. Crossing John Ward Creek at this section of the trail poses a risk that we want to alert our horse community to, as it could potentially cause harm to both horse and rider. We will be working as quickly as possible to mitigate this problem."

Summer Heat and Volunteer Hours

With the 160th Battle Anniversary now over, the park is in the height of summer. Who would know given that Georgia has been experiencing extreme temperatures since the spring. However, it is always good to remember how to remain safe while volunteering during the summer months. So please remember some of the following tips while you are at the park, either while volunteering or enjoying a hike.

- 1. Wear appropriate clothing. Choose lightweight, loose-fitting clothing, but remember to ensure it is also appropriate for the task you are completing.
- 2. Schedule outdoor activities carefully.
 - Although this may not always be possible at the park, it is best to work during the morning and evening hours, when it is the coolest. Also, remember to take breaks often in shady areas for your body to recover.
- 3. Pace yourself. Start slowly and pick up the pace gradually.
 - STOP WORKING!: If exertion in the heat make your heart pound and leaves you gasping for breath,
 STOP all activity. Get into a cool area or into the shade, and rest, especially if you become lightheaded, confused, weak, or faint. Also, call 911 if needed.
- 4. Wear sunscreen, a wide-brimmed hat, and sunglasses. Don't forget to reapply sunscreen throughout the day.
- 5. Avoid hot and heavy meals.
- 6. Stay hydrated.
 - Drink plenty of fluids!: Drink more fluids, regardless of how active you are, don't wait until you're thirsty, stay away from very sugary drinks, and avoid very cold drinks – they can cause stomach cramps.
- 7. Replace salts and minerals.
 - A sports drink can replace the salt and minerals you lose in sweat.
- 8. Stay Informed. Check the forecast.
- 9. Know the signs of heat-related illnesses.
- 10. Use a buddy system.
- 11. Check on people who are at high risk.

Always remember to talk to your doctor if you have any specific concerns, especially if you have chronic health conditions, take medications, or are in a high-risk category.

New Bridge Proposal

The Friends group is writing a grant request for \$40,000 from the National Park Foundation, due July 15. This request is for a pre-fab bridge that is 48' long and 8' wide going across a large creek on a proposed new trail, which will be made public once the grant is approved. The estimated bridge cost is \$48,000. The Friends must raise an additional \$20,000 to complete the bridge installation and approach trails. Superintendant Patrick Gamman's target installation date is the February 2025 workday if we get the grant and raise the \$20,000 Matching fund by November 1st.







EARTHWORKS

Workday 07-13-24

This work plan covered the removal and replacement of the bridge that goes toward the Visitor Center from Gilbert Road and is about a half mile past the 24 Gun Battery. We were to replace the 7'x16' rotting bridge with a heavy duty 8'x16' bridge with quard rails.

On Friday, July 12, Aron, Bill, Stewart, and I reviewed the work with David at the work site.

We had 10 crew leaders for the workday. The Crew Leaders were Anna, Aron P, Bill, Curt, Fred, Geoff, Robert, Scott, Stewart, and Mike. We had 2 Crew Leaders under instruction, they were Aashrith and Aaron O, and 4 Trail Ambassadors: Debbie, Don, Yvonne, and Wendy. They did registration, directed the volunteers to the parking area, and assisted with directing visitors around the work area. We had 8 volunteers. The volunteers were from the Atlanta Outdoor Club (5, I am part of both), a Scout, and individuals.

On Saturday at 8 am, while I welcomed the volunteers and conducted the safety briefing, the Crew Leaders headed for the work site to start removing the old bridge. Shortly thereafter I followed with the volunteers as they proceeded to the work site they stopped at the staged materials and started moving the materials to the work site over 500' away. While some of the Crew Leaders and a couple of volunteers removed the old bridge and built the new bridge, the remaining volunteers continuously brought new material and removed the old material. To quote a husband-and-wife couple joining us for their first workday, "I think we chose the wrong workday to be out first." About noon everyone that could not stay longer left leaving a few volunteers and Crew Leaders. These gradually left as time passed. Our

The Trail Club will provide supervision and tools. Volunteers should wear long pants and closed toed shoes. Participants are encouraged to bring their own water, work gloves and masks. The NPS Volunteer Service Agreement and COVID forms are required, signed by a parent or guardian, if the student is under 18 years old. For August's work day, parking and registration will be in the field near the Visitor's Center. Vehicle Entrance Passes will issued at registration.
