John Ward Creek Crossing Closed to Horseback Riders

Kennesaw, GA – Effective immediately, the John Ward Creek crossing just south of the Illinois Monument is closed to horseback riders until further notice. This closure stems from a safety concern due to hazardous conditions relating to an unstable streambed. The closure affects the creek crossing between Milepost 3.5 and Milepost 4 of the Kolb's Farm East Trail.

Superintendent Patrick Gamman states, "We are concerned for the safety of all park users. Crossing John Ward Creek at this section of the trail poses a risk that we want to alert our horse community to, as it could potentially cause harm to both horse and rider. We will be working as quickly as possible to mitigate this problem."





Museum Tours every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday @ 2:00 pm!

February 1st, @11 am-African American Inventors

In telling the story of the United States, creativity and innovation are central themes. During this short presentation, one of our rangers will detail some of the notable people of color that made incredible advancements and inventions.

<u>February 2nd, @11 am - 24 - Gun Battery Hike</u>

"The enemy's fire ceased after about 10 minutes, but created a path of destruction while it lasted"-Confederate Captain James Hoskins on the U.S. 24-Gun Battery. Join this approximately 1.5
mile, ranger-led hike to the site of this 24-gun position. The hike will include opportunities to see
pre – and - post war history in the park, as well as a chance to see some of its wonderful natural
resources.

February 8th, @ 11 am - 13th Amendment Lecture

While Abraham Lincoln would not live to see the affect of his Emancipation Proclamation, it's legacy would be cemented by the 13th Amendment. Officially outlawing the institution of slavery in the United States, this amendment would be one of the first large scale steps towards civil rights in the wake of the Civil War. Join us for a ranger - led lecture on the topic.

<u>February 9th, @11 am – Assault Trail Hike</u>

On June 27th, 1864, nearly 9,000 Union soldiers made a historic charge into what they believed would be death or capture. Follow in the footsteps of these brave men as this ranger - guided tour explores the heaviest area of fighting during the battle.

*The hike will begin at the Activity Area 3 parking lot and end at the Illinois Monument.

February 15th, @11 am - Shaping Lincoln: Before the Presidency

In recognition of Abraham Lincoln's 215th Birthday, this program discusses Abraham Lincoln prior to his presidency and what shaped the 16th President of the United States of America. This program will be held at the Visitor Center patio.

<u>February 22nd, @ 1 pm - Navigating the Great Outdoors: ELMs, Maps, and Compasses</u>

Learn how to use Emergency Location Markers (ELMs) to stay safe and assist in emergencies while mastering traditional navigation skills with maps and compasses. This hands-on workshop will




These positions are needed to advance the Friend's mission as the Philanthropic Partner of Kennesaw Mountain NBP, NPS.





We are back in the business of trail maintenance! See the sign-up links, above. We are still limiting our numbers, but anyone one is now welcome to sign-up.

The Trail Club will provide supervision and tools. Volunteers should wear work clothes (long pants are required) and closed toed shoes. Participants are encouraged to bring their own water, work gloves and masks. The NPS Volunteer Service Agreement and COVID forms are required, signed by a parent or guardian, if the student is under 18 years old. For February's work day, parking and registration will be in the field near the Visitor's Center. Vehicle Entrance Passes will issued at registration. Registration will begin at 8:30 am.

If your school, church, business, or community organization would like to schedule a special work day as a team building or public service activity, e-mail us at trails@

kennesawmountaintrailclub.org at least 4 weeks in advance. Trail work can be performed any day of the week.

We work closely with the Park Service and assist the park staff by providing critically needed volunteer effort to install signs, build bridges, and maintain the 20+ miles of trails. Since our beginning in 2002, the Trail Club has donated over 281,000 volunteer hours to Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park.

We hope to see you at a work day as soon as we return to our normal work days.

Cancellation policy

If rain is forecast for the work day, we will issue a cancellation notice on our website at least 24 hours before hand. In addition, during the winter months, if the temperature is forecast to be below 40 degrees, we will also issue a cancellation at least 24 hours prior to the work day.
