John Ward Creek Crossing Closed to Horseback Riders

Kennesaw, GA – Effective immediately, the John Ward Creek crossing just south of the Illinois Monument is closed to horseback riders until further notice. This closure stems from a safety concern due to hazardous conditions relating to an unstable streambed. The closure affects the creek crossing between Milepost 3.5 and Milepost 4 of the Kolb's Farm East Trail.

Superintendent Patrick Gamman states, "We are concerned for the safety of all park users. Crossing John Ward Creek at this section of the trail poses a risk that we want to alert our horse community to, as it could potentially cause harm to both horse and rider. We will be working as quickly as possible to mitigate this problem."




Figure 12. Proposed Improvements to the Landscape Around the Wallis House

Museum Tours every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday @ 2:00 pm!

November 2 @ 11 am- Guided Museum Tour

Ever wanted to enjoy our museum tour, but couldn't make it out during the week? You're in luck! This hour-long program will highlight the main points of the Civil War, culminating in the Atlanta Campaign of 1864. We will use the artifacts of the museum and our education collection as a medium to tell our story. A great primer for anyone interested in the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain!

November 3 @ 11 am- Mountaintop Hike

This ranger-led hike will take you roughly 1 mile up to the peak of Big Kennesaw Mountain. Along the way, you'll learn about the flora and fauna of the area and the history that shapes us from prehistory, through Civil War and on to today. The hike is semi-strenuous so bring water and good shoes!

November 9 @ 11 am , 12 pm, 2 pm & 3 pm- Infantry Demonstrations

The Civil War was the first modern war in history, fought using tactics and techniques still relevant to the battlefield today. Come out and experience our living historians as they encamp and offer rifle firing demonstrations at the above- listed times.

November 10th @ 11 am, 12 pm, 2 pm & 3 pm – Artillery Demonstrations

Artillery was a vital component to the operations of both armies during the Atlanta Campaign and played a key role in several engagements during the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain. Our living historians will hold camp at the Visitor Center and shoot the cannon at the above-listed times.

November 16 @11 am- Cheatham Hill Battlefield Walk

Come on out and enjoy a casual, history-focused walk around one of the most significant sites of the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain. Hear accounts from Union and Confederate survivors, and fully experience the area that would earn the nickname of the "Dead Angle".

November 17 @ 11 am - Civil War Soldier Gear and Artifacts Layout

Life for the infantry soldier (Union or Confederate) was anything but easy. Long marches, bad food, and worse living conditions made it tough going for these young men. Join us as we lay out the gear that made such intense campaigning possible. You will see period-correct uniforms, weaponry and even get up close and personal with artifacts from the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain!

November 23 @11 am- The Western and Atlantic Railroad Talk

For four months during the summer of 1864, two massive armies struggled daily for control over an artery of supplies leading straight to the heart of the Confederate war machine: Atlanta, Georgia. Hundreds of railroad cars would travel daily to the besieged trenches. Come learn about the logistics behind making an army move, and why Kennesaw Mountain's defenses were so important

November 24 @ 11 am- Picket Line Walk

for the Union forces to negotiate.

The Battle of Kennesaw Mountain was a large-scale offensive with many moving parts. One of the first actions of that day was a diversionary attack at the base of Kennesaw Mountain itself and part of the way up the slope. Join one of our rangers for a short walk along this line of battle as they detail the techniques, tactics, and aftermath of this fateful assault. This walk includes rolling, rocky terrain and is approximately 1.3 mile long.

November 30 @ 11 am- All About Artillery Talk

Artillery is known as the King of Battle. It ruled as one of the deadliest factors during the brutal trench warfare seen on the slopes of Kennesaw Mountain. Come on out and learn about this weapon of war, to include showcasing actual artifacts found from the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain.



New Bridge Proposal

The Friends group had submitted a grant request for \$40,000 from the National Park Foundation. While the project was not funded, we are still committed to the project. This request is for a pre-fab bridge that is 48' long and 8' wide going across a large creek on a proposed new trail, which will be made public once the funds are raised. The estimated bridge cost is ~\$52,000 and \$8,000 to complete the bridge installation and approach trails. Superintendant Patrick Gamman's target installation date is the February 2025 workday Therefore, we need to raise the \$60,000 by mid-January, 2025.

Workday 10-12-24

On Friday, October 11, Bill, Eric, Rich, Tom, and Mike reviewed the work planned and put the flags out.

This work plan covered the part of the Hardage Mill Trail from where it meets the Nose Creek Trail going south and follows Noses Creek to the Noses Creek Trail by the Noses Creek Bridge. We were to perform annual maintenance on this part of the trail.

We had 13 crew leaders for the workday. The Crew Leaders were Bill, Curt, Donald, Eric, Fred, Geoff, Rich, Scott, Thomas G, Tom, and Mike. We had 2 Crew Leaders under instruction, they were Aashrith and Aaron O. We had 4 Trail Ambassadors; they were Debbie, Doug, Karen, and Laurie. They did registration and directed the volunteers to the parking area. We had 20 volunteers. The volunteers were from Hillgrove HS NJROTC Unit (3), Allatoona HS NJROTC (10), the Atlanta Outdoor Club (5, I am in that number) and individuals (2).

the day's work plan, conducted the safety briefing, and split our volunteers into two teams at the end of the Pigeon Hill Parking Lot. I then went between Teams answering questions and ensuring the work plan was being followed. Fred took pictures, Donald assisted with registration, and Geoff watched the parking lot along with the Trail Ambassadors.

Team 1 was led by Tom with Curt, Scott, and Thoms G assisting. He had Aashrith in training plus the individuals, Hillgrove HS NJROTC Unit, and the Atlanta Outdoor Club. They worked on lines 1 and 3 of the work plan. They cleaned the conduit on line 1, eliminated trail creep, and deberming as needed on lines 1 and 3 of the work plan.

Team 2 was led by Eric with Bill and Rich assisting. He had Aron O in training plus the Allatoona JROTC Unit. They worked on lines 2, 5, and 6 of the work plan. They deberming and eliminated trail creep as needed on lines 2, 5, and 6 of the work plan. Line 6 covering the point where the Hardage Mill Trail meets Noses Creek to the Noses Creek Bridge had only one spot needing maintenance that took only a couple of minutes.

Line 4 was to have no work performed on it until a decision is made on how to handle this extremely eroded section of the trail and compliance has been completed if required. This line was in the work plan purely to note the location of where we would not be working. A blowdown of about 2" in diameter crossing the trail at about neck high was removed.

Overall, this workday was to work on water flow issues that had arisen since the last time we worked in this area, about 19 months ago. We did accomplish all the lines on the work plan that required deberming. The trail has weathered well during this time and did not require as much work as might be expected with the number of hikers now using this trail.




